



## Clubhouse Rules & Dress Code

### On the Course

As a modern, progressive golf club we recognise how acceptable golf attire has progressed over recent years, however, it is equally recognised that golfers must maintain a respectable standard. See information below for guidance.

Smart recognised golf apparel must be worn at all times, if you are in any doubt please ask in the Professional shop rather than risk the embarrassment of being told.

### Unacceptable clothing includes:

- Denim, football attire, beach wear, cargo or combat trousers & trainers
- Caps must be worn in conventional mode
- Shirts should have collars or turtle neck and be tucked in
- Tailored shorts are acceptable, with predominately white socks
- Recognised golf shoes must be worn

### In The Clubhouse

All members and visitors must have a reasonable standard of dress in the Clubhouse. The general dress code is 'smart casual' unless there is a function when a change in dress code will be advised.

- Dress at all times must be clean.
- Outdoor coats & jacket must be hung in the hallway.
- Clean and tidy working clothes will be permitted in the Clubhouse with the exception of soiled or outdoor wear.
- Smart jeans or denims (not ripped) may be worn.
- T shirts must not be emblazoned with anything that can be construed as offensive.
- Hats or caps are not permitted.
- Sports clothes (including football and rugby shirts) may be worn with the exception of track suits.
- Spiked golf shoes are NOT permitted.

Any person improperly dressed will be informed politely by a staff or committee member and will be requested to dress in accordance with the club's dress rules.
